## Pro Life Report

Brother Greg followed up on a Sunday email from John Coppard, BC Yukon State Pro Life Director, and was able to enlist his wife Barbara and Maura McCappin (St. Mary's) to accompany him to the Vancouver Court House on Monday to support protesters at the start of the "Carter Case". This case seeks to legalize euthanasia and assisted suicide. There were about 100 protesters and media crews from five or six outlets present.

Brother John Coppard and Dr. Will Johnston, a Vancouver physician who is spokesman for the B.C. chapter of the Euthanasia Prevention Coalition of Canada, were interviewed by the various media outlets at length. Dr. Johnston noted that Scotland and Australia have gone through the same examination of their laws as Canada is now doing and have rejected enabling assisted suicide. Coppard, who's recovering from stage IV brain cancer, said a new drug saved his life. He said he worries that legalizing assisted suicide would make it too easy for people - including doctors - to give up the fight for health and take a fast exit out of life. "I'm concerned because I've been through rough points, like a lot of people with what I have," he said.

Is this the beginning of another slippery slope like that of abortion in 1969? We need to let our views be known!

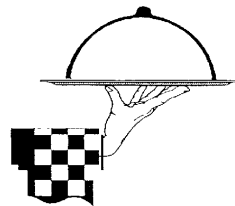
## Christmas Light-Up

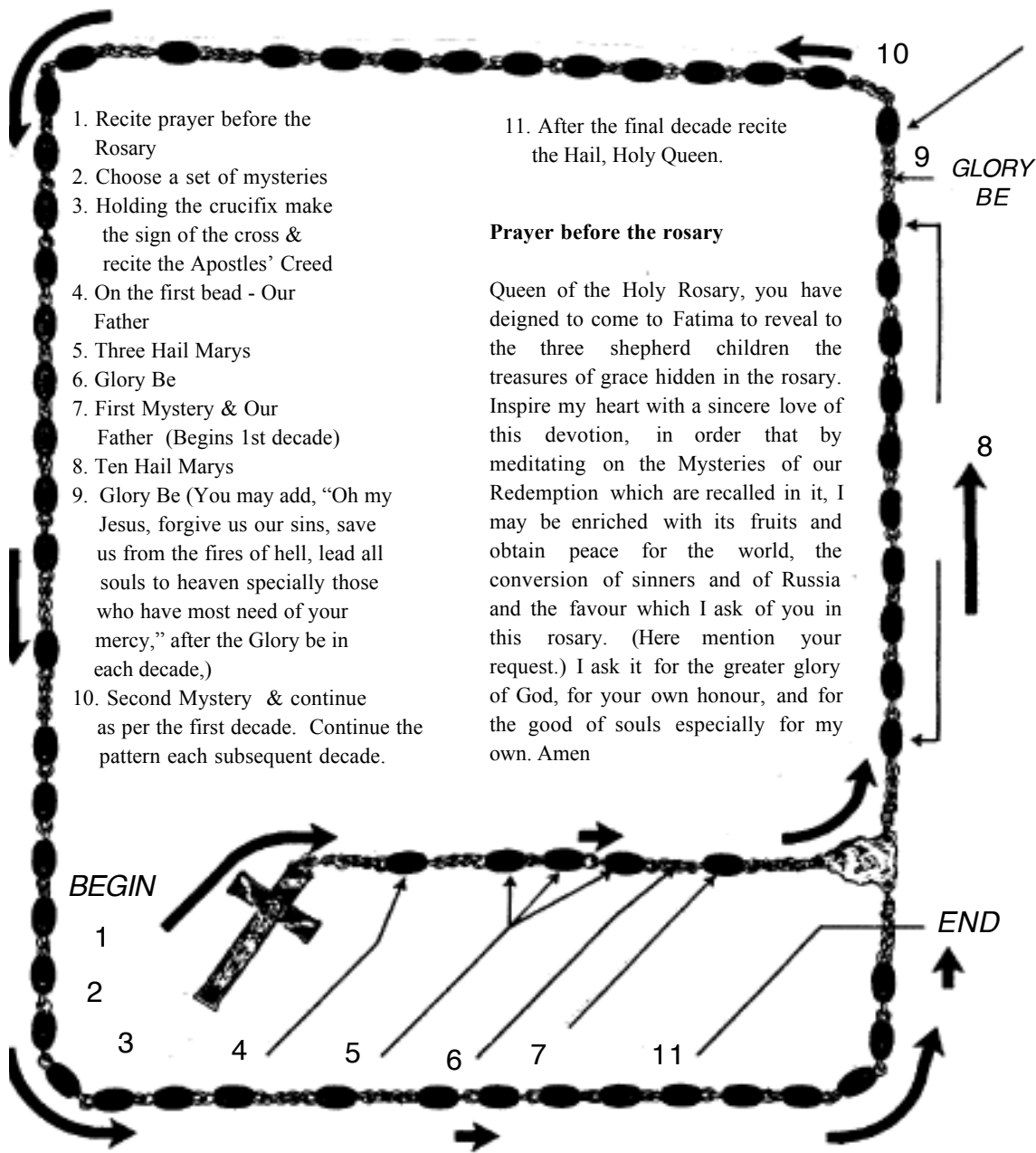

1. Recite prayer before the Rosary
2. Choose a set of mysteries
3. Holding the crucifix make the sign of the cross & recite the Apostles' Creed
4. On the first bead - Our Father
5. Three Hail Marys
6. Glory Be
7. First Mystery & Our Father (Begins 1st decade)
8. Ten Hail Marys
9. Glory Be (You may add, "Oh my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to heaven specially those who have most need of your mercy," after the Glory be in each decade.)
10. Second Mystery & continue as per the first decade. Continue the pattern each subsequent decade.

11. After the final decade recite the Hail, Holy Queen.

### Prayer before the rosary

Queen of the Holy Rosary, you have deigned to come to Fatima to reveal to the three shepherd children the treasures of grace hidden in the rosary. Inspire my heart with a sincere love of this devotion, in order that by meditating on the Mysteries of our Redemption which are recalled in it, I may be enriched with its fruits and obtain peace for the world, the conversion of sinners and of Russia and the favour which I ask of you in this rosary.
